ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 9TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ENGLISH 9 COVERS GRAMMAR, SOME WRITING, AND PROOFREADING SKILLS. IT ALSO INCLUDES THE STUDY OF THE FICTION AND NONFICTION SHORT STORY, POETRY, A SHAKESPEAREAN PLAY, AND THE NOVEL. MALE AND FEMALE WRITERS ARE STUDIED AS WELL AS AUTHORS FROM VARIOUS CULTURES. GRADES ARE COMPILED FROM DAILY WORK AND HOMEWORK, MINOR QUIZZES, PERIODIC EXAMINATIONS, AND A SEMESTER FINAL.

COURSE NUMBER: 110

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED PRE-REQUISITE: ENGLISH 9 COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 10TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ENGLISH 10 COMPLETES A STUDENT'S STUDY OF GRAMMAR AND STRUCTURE. LITERATURE STUDIES ARE IN GREATER DETAIL THAN ENGLISH 9 AND INCLUDE THE SHORT STORY, NOVEL, SHAKESPEAREAN PLAY, POETRY, AND ESSAYS. AUTHORS ARE REPRESENTATIVE OF A VARIETY OF CULTURES AND TIME PERIODS AS WELL AS BOTH SEXES. GRADES ARE COMPILED FROM DAILY WORK AND HOMEWORK, MINOR QUIZZES, PERIODIC EXAMINATIONS, AND A SEMESTER FINAL.

COURSE NUMBER: 111

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED PRE-REQUISITE: ENGLISH 10 COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ENGLISH 11 IS A COMPREHENSIVE COURSE FOR JUNIORS INCLUDING THE REINFORCEMENT OF GRAMMAR SKILLS THROUGH VARIOUS APPLICATIONS. TOPICS WILL INCLUDE AMERICAN LITERATURE STUDIES (HAWTHORNE, POE, AND THOREAU), PUBLIC SPEAKING SKILLS, AND A CAREER DEVELOPMENT.

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ENGLISH LITERATURE IS A CHALLENGING SEMESTER CLASS FOR JUNIORS AND SENIORS ONLY. THIS SURVEY CLASS WILL HIGHLIGHT ENGLISH LITERATURE IN A CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER WITH EMPHASIS ON BEOWULF, CANTERBURY TALES, HAMLET, JOHN DONNE, AND ROMANTIC AND VICTORIAN POETRY. AT LEAST SIX UNITS OF STUDY WILL BE COVERED AND TESTED. A FORMAL PAPER WILL BE ASSIGNED INVOLVING LITERARY RESEARCH.

COURSE NAME: THE MODERN NOVEL

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This class is designed to broaden and enrich the student's study of literature in the world throughout the last century. Coursework will revolve around the study of novelists prominent in the 20^{TH} century including George Orwell, Flannery O'Connor, Edith Wharton, and Harper Lee. Literary research and writing skills will also be emphasized, as well as student choice of novels for individual projects.

STUDENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO READ A SET AMOUNT OF PAGES PER QUARTER AND JOURNAL AS THEY READ. THE ELEMENTS OF LITERATURE WILL BE STUDIED AND STUDENTS WILL RESEARCH THEIR BOOKS TO PREPARE ELECTRONIC PRESENTATIONS WHICH DISPLAY ANALYSIS OF EACH BOO. SOME BOOKS WILL BE READ IN THE GROUP SETTING AS WELL.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: RESEARCH PAPERS TO BE DONE ON VARIOUS TOPICS TO INCLUDE: COLLECTION AND EVALUATION OF DATA IN A FORMAL PRESENTATION; RESEARCH OF A LOCAL HISTORICAL/FOLK AREA; RESEARCH OF AN INDIVIDUAL (BIOGRAPHY); OTHER OPTIONS AVAILABLE. PAPERS WILL BE FROM THREE TO FIVE PAGES OR AS THE SUBJECT REQUIRES.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is required for students who score lower than the 40th percentile in reading comprehension on their junior lowa Assessments and/or who have a D composite average for English 9, English 10, and English 11. Students who scored lower than the 50th percentile may elect to take this course. All other students are not eligible to take this course. This course will review the essential concepts of language arts and reading comprehension to help assure graduates will have necessary reading skills to be successful after graduation.

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COURSE NAME: PRE-ALGEBRA

COURSE NUMBER: 210

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 8TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This mathematics class weaves three themes-applied arithmetic, pre-algebra, and pregeometry-by focusing on arithmetic operations in mathematics and the real world. Variables are used as pattern generalizers, abbreviations in formulas, and unknowns in problems, and are represented on the number line and graphed in the coordinate plane. Basic arithmetic and algebraic skills are connected to corresponding geometry topics.

COURSE NAME: ALGEBRA 1

Course Number: 212

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 9TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ALGEBRA 1 IS A STUDY OF THE UNKNOWN THAT ISN'T REALLY DIFFICULT. IT'S JUST DIFFERENT. IT PREPARES YOU TO CONTINUE YOUR STUDY OF MATHEMATICS AND TO HELP YOU ORGANIZE YOUR THOUGHTS AND TO SOLVE PROBLEMS THAT EVERYONE MEETS FROM DAY TO DAY. IT'S A PRACTICE IN SOLVING AND GRAPHING LINEAR EQUATIONS. WE STUDY THE USE OF EXPONENTS AND HOW THEY ARE AFFECTED BY DIFFERENT OPERATIONS. THERE ARE STORY PROBLEMS THAT DEAL WITH UNIFORM MOTION, PERCENTS, AGES, MONEY AND TRIANGLES. WE SPEND SOME TIME LEARNING HOW TO USE THE SLOPE AND Y-INTERCEPT METHODS TO GRAPH EQUATIONS. WE ALSO FIND PERIMETER, AREAS, AND VOLUMES OF GEOMETRIC FIGURES. ALL STUDENTS (BOYS AND GIRLS) ARE ENCOURAGED TO TAKE THIS CLASS IF IT WILL MEET THEIR NEEDS, AND THERE ARE STORY PROBLEMS THAT ARE MULTI-CULTURAL AND NON-SEXIST.

COURSE NAME: GEOMETRY

Course Number: 220

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: ALGEBRA 1 COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 10TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THIS COURSE PROVIDES EXPERIENCE DRAWING, CONSTRUCTING, MEASURING, VISUALIZING, COMPARING, TRANSFORMING, AND CLASSIFYING GEOMETRIC FIGURES. YOU WILL HAVE HAD EXPERIENCE REASONING ABOUT THOSE FIGURES AND SEPARATING FACT FROM OPINION.

COURSE NAME: ADVANCED ALGEBRA

COURSE NUMBER: 222

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: ALGEBRA 1 COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 10TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ADVANCED ALGEBRA IS AN ABSTRACT STUDY OF THE WAY NUMBERS BEHAVE AND INTERRELATE. IT PREPARES YOU TO NOT ONLY CONTINUE IN YOUR STUDY OF MATHEMATICS, BUT WILL HELP OPEN DOORS TO CHEMISTRY, PHYSICS, AND OTHER MATHEMATICALLY BASED DISCIPLINES. WE REVIEW ALL THE TOPICS OF ALGEBRA 1 AND THEN WEAVE IN MORE DIFFICULT CONCEPTS SUCH AS COMPLETING THE SQUARE, USE OF THE QUADRATIC FORMULA, SIMPLIFICATION OF RADICALS, AND COMPLEX NUMBERS. THERE ARE MANY STORY PROBLEMS INVOLVING CONSECUTIVE NUMBERS, POLYNOMIAL AND USE OF 2 EQUATIONS AND 2 VARIABLES TO SOLVE PROBLEMS. TWO YEARS OF ALGEBRA IS A MINIMUM REQUIREMENT FOR MOST COLLEGES SO IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO TAKE THIS COURSE IF YOU ARE THINKING ABOUT COLLEGE. ALL STUDENTS (BOYS AND GIRLS) ARE ENCOURAGED TO TAKE THIS CLASS IF IT WILL MEET THEIR NEEDS, AND THERE ARE STORY PROBLEMS THAT ARE MULTI-CULTURAL AND NON-SEXIST.

COURSE NAME: MATH ANALYSIS

Course Number: 224

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE
PRE-REQUISITE: ADVANCED ALGEBRA

COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE SUBJECTS OF SEPARATE GEOMETRY, STATISTICS AND TRIGONOMETRY ARE INTEGRATED THROUGHOUT THIS COURSE. THIS IS A GOOD COURSE TO TAKE IF YOU PLAN ON GOING TO COLLEGE, BUT IT TAKES AN HOUR EACH DAY TO COMPLETE THE HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS AND MASTER THE WORK. ALL STUDENTS (BOYS AND GIRLS) ARE ENCOURAGED TO TAKE THIS CLASS IF IT WILL MEET THEIR NEEDS, AND THERE ARE STORY PROBLEMS THAT ARE MULTICULTURAL AND NON-SEXIST.

COURSE NAME: ESSENTIAL SKILLS MATH

Course Number: 230

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: ASSIGNED COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 12TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is required for students who score lower than the 40^{TH} percentile in mathematics on their junior lowa Assessments and/or who have a D composite average for their 9^{TH} , 10^{TH} , and 11^{TH} grade math courses. Students who scored lower than the 50^{TH} percentile may elect to take this course. All other students are not eligible to take this course. This course will review the essential concepts of mathematics to help assure graduates will have necessary math skills to be successful after graduation.

COURSE NAME: CONSUMER MATH


Course Number: 298

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: ASSIGNED COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 12TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE PURPOSE OF CONSUMER MATH IS TO REVIEW ELEMENTARY ARITHMETIC, INCLUDING FRACTIONS, DECIMALS, AND PERCENTAGES, ELEMENTARY ALGEBRA WHEN SOLVING PRACTICAL BUSINESS PROBLEMS. THE PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS INCLUDE: CHANGING MONEY, CHECKING ACCOUNTS, BUDGETING, PRICE DISCOUNTS, MARKUPS AND MARKDOWNS, PAYROLL CALCULATIONS, INVESTING (SIMPLE AND COMPOUND INTEREST), TAXES, CONSUMER CREDIT, AND MORTGAGES. THE EMPHASIS WILL BE ON COMPUTATIONAL SKILLS AND THEIR PRACTICAL APPLICATION, WITH PRACTICAL APPLICATION BEING THE MAIN FOCUS.

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COURSE NAME: PHYSICAL SCIENCE

Course Number: 310

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 9TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Physical Science is the study of matter and energy. This course covers basic principles of both physics and chemistry and emphasizes everyday applications of physical laws. Matter is studied in relation to its classification, patterns, and changes. Energy is studied in relation to motion, heat, sound, light, electricity, and alternative resources. Regular hands-on laboratory activities reinforce the textbook material. Within each chapter careers are discussed which relate to the topic.

COURSE NAME: BIOLOGY

COURSE NUMBER: 320

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: REQUIRED

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 10TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: BIOLOGY IS THE STUDY OF LIVING ORGANISMS AND THE UNIQUE PROPERTIES THAT SET THEM APART FROM NON-LIVING MATTER. BASIC CELL PROCESSES ARE INTRODUCED, INCLUDING CELL STRUCTURE, CHEMISTRY, AND ENERGY REACTIONS. GENETICS, INHERITANCE, AND GENETIC ENGINEERING ARE DISCUSSES ALONG WITH PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS. ECOLOGY AND CURRENT ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS ARE ADDRESSED. THE DIVERSITY OF LIFE FROM BACTERIA TO REPRESENTATIVE PLANTS AND ANIMALS IS PRESENTED, AS WELL AS COVERAGE OF MAJOR HUMAN BODY SYSTEMS. REGULAR HANDS-ON LABORATORY ACTIVITIES REINFORCE THE TEXTBOOK MATERIAL. EACH UNIT PRESENTS A CAREER IN OR RELATED TO BIOLOGY.

COURSE NAME: CHEMISTRY

Course Number: 312

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE
PRE-REQUISITE: PHYSICAL SCIENCE

COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: CHEMISTRY IS THE STUDY OF THE COMPOSITION, PROPERTIES, AND STRUCTURE OF SUBSTANCES AND THE CHANGES THEY UNDERGO. TOPICS INCLUDE THE PERIODIC LAW, CHEMICAL FORMULAS AND REACTIONS, PHASES OF MATTER, AND A BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO ORGANIC CHEMISTRY. REGULAR HANDS-ON LABORATORY ACTIVITIES REINFORCE THE TEXTBOOK MATERIAL. VARIOUS CAREERS WHICH USE A CHEMISTRY BACKGROUND ARE PRESENTED. THIS COURSE IS GEARED TOWARD STUDENTS WHO PLAN ON POST HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION.

COURSE NAME: ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY

Course Number: 324

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE

PRE-REQUISITE: BIOLOGY COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: ANATOMY IS THE DETAILED STUDY IN WORKING ON THE HUMAN ORGANISM. IT STARTS WITH THE ORGANIZATION OF THE HUMAN BODY AND GOES THROUGH THE DIFFERENT SYSTEMS. THE STUDY OF THE CELL, TISSUES, ORGANS, AND SYSTEMS ARE DONE WITH VERY TECHNICAL TERMINOLOGY. EACH CHAPTER IS BROKEN DOWN INTO ANATOMY, PHYSIOLOGY, AND DISORDERS THAT AFFECT THE HUMAN. REGULAR HANDS-ON LABORATORY ACTIVITIES REINFORCE THE TEXTBOOK MATERIAL. THIS IS A CLASS THAT WOULD SATISFY THE STUDENT WHO IS INTERESTED IN A MEDICAL VOCATION OR PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

COURSE NAME: PHYSICS

COURSE NUMBER: 314

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ELECTIVE PRE-REQUISITE: ALGEBRA 1 COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 11TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Physics is the study of matter and energy. The main topics are the mechanics of force, motion, work, and energy; heat, including its effects on matter and energy; electricity and magnetism; and waves, light, and sound. Regular hands-on laboratory activities reinforce the textbook material. This course is geared toward students who plan on post high school education and is especially helpful to anyone considering a career in a technical field. Enrollment in or completion of Algebra 2 would be of great help.

COURSE NAME: ESSENTIAL SKILLS SCIENCE

Course Number: 330

CREDITS: 2

ELECTIVE/REQUIRED: ASSIGN

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 12TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is required for students who score lower than the 40^{TH} percentile in science on their junior lowa Assessments and/or who have a D composite average for their physical science, biology, and their 11^{TH} grade science courses. Students who scored lower than the 50^{TH} percentile may elect to take this course. All other students are not eligible to take this course. This course will review the essential concepts in science to help assure graduates will have necessary science skills to be successful after graduation.

COURSE NAME: SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IN SOCIETY

COURSE NUMBER: 325


CREDITS: 2

PRE-REQUISITE: NONE COURSE LOCATION: SPHS

GRADE LEVEL: 10TH

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THIS CLASS FOCUSES ON THE EVER CHANGING WORLD AND HOW TECHNOLOGY CAN HAVE A POSITIVE AND/OR NEGATIVE IMPACT ON SOCIETY. THE CLASS DOES RESEARCH PROJECTS, PRESENTATIONS, AND EDITS WEBSITES. THEY ALSO WORK WITH LEGO ROBOTICS WHICH ALLOWS THEM TO WORK ON COMPUTER PROGRAMMING. 

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE AP ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND COMPOSITION COURSE ALIGNS TO AN INTRODUCTORY COLLEGE-LEVEL RHETORIC AND WRITING CURRICULUM, WHICH REQUIRES STUDENTS TO DEVELOP EVIDENCE-BASED ANALYTIC AND ARGUMENTATIVE ESSAYS THAT PROCEED THROUGH SEVERAL STAGES OR DRAFTS. STUDENTS EVALUATE, SYNTHESIZE, AND CITE RESEARCH TO SUPPORT THEIR ARGUMENTS. THROUGHOUT THE COURSE, STUDENTS DEVELOP A PERSONAL STYLE BY MAKING APPROPRIATE GRAMMATICAL CHOICES. ADDITIONALLY, STUDENTS READ AND ANALYZE THE RHETORICAL ELEMENTS AND THEIR EFFECTS IN NON-FICTION TEXTS, INCLUDING GRAPHIC IMAGES AS FORMS OF TEXT, FROM MANY DISCIPLINES AND HISTORICAL PERIODS.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE AP ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION COURSE ALIGNS TO AN INTRODUCTORY COLLEGE-LEVEL LITERARY ANALYSIS COURSE. THE COURSE ENGAGES STUDENTS IN THE CLOSE READING AND CRITICAL ANALYSIS OF IMAGINATIVE LITERATURE TO DEEPEN THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE WAYS WRITERS USE LANGUAGE TO PROVIDE BOTH MEANING AND PLEASURE. AS THEY READ, STUDENTS CONSIDER A WORK'S STRUCTURE, STYLE, AND THEMES, AS WELL AS ITS USE OF FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE, IMAGERY, SYMBOLISM, AND TONE. WRITING ASSIGNMENTS INCLUDE EXPOSITORY, ANALYTICAL, AND ARGUMENTATIVE ESSAYS THAT REQUIRE STUDENTS TO ANALYZE AND INTERPRET LITERARY WORKS.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE AP STATISTICS COURSE IS EQUIVALENT TO A ONE-SEMESTER, INTRODUCTORY, NON-CALCULUS-BASED COLLEGE COURSE IN STATISTICS. THE COURSE INTRODUCES STUDENTS TO THE MAJOR CONCEPTS AND TOOLS FOR COLLECTING, ANALYZING, AND DRAWING CONCLUSIONS FROM DATA. THERE ARE FOUR THEMES IN THE AP STATISTICS COURSE: EXPLORING DATA, SAMPLING AND EXPERIMENTATION, ANTICIPATING PATTERNS, AND STATISTICAL INFERENCE. STUDENTS USE TECHNOLOGY, INVESTIGATIONS, PROBLEM SOLVING, AND WRITING AS THEY BUILD CONCEPTUAL UNDERSTANDING.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: THE AP SPANISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSE EMPHASIZES COMMUNICATION (UNDERSTANDING AND BEING UNDERSTOOD BY OTHERS) BY APPLYING INTERPERSONAL, INTERPRETIVE, AND PRESENTATIONAL SKILLS IN REAL-LIFE SITUATIONS. THIS INCLUDES VOCABULARY USAGE, LANGUAGE CONTROL, COMMUNICATION STRATEGIES, AND CULTURAL AWARENESS. THE AP SPANISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSE STRIVES NOT TO OVEREMPHASIZE GRAMMATICAL ACCURACY AT THE EXPENSE OF COMMUNICATION. TO BEST FACILITATE THE STUDY OF LANGUAGE AND CULTURE, THE COURSE IS TAUGHT ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY IN SPANISH. THE AP SPANISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSE ENGAGES STUDENTS IN AN EXPLORATION OF CULTURE IN BOTH CONTEMPORARY AND HISTORICAL CONTEXTS. THE COURSE DEVELOPS STUDENTS' AWARENESS AND APPRECIATION OF CULTURAL PRODUCTS (E.G., TOOLS, BOOKS, MUSIC, LAWS, CONVENTIONS, INSTITUTIONS); PRACTICES (PATTERNS OF SOCIAL INTERACTIONS WITHIN A CULTURE); AND PERSPECTIVES (VALUES, ATTITUDES, AND ASSUMPTIONS).

COURSE DESCRIPTION: AP UNITED STATES HISTORY FOCUSES ON DEVELOPING STUDENTS' ABILITIES TO THINK CONCEPTUALLY ABOUT U.S. HISTORY FROM APPROXIMATELY 1491 TO THE PRESENT AND APPLY HISTORICAL THINKING SKILLS AS THEY LEARN ABOUT THE PAST. SEVEN THEMES OF EQUAL IMPORTANCE — IDENTITY; PEOPLING; POLITICS AND POWER; WORK, EXCHANGE, AND TECHNOLOGY; AMERICA IN THE WORLD; ENVIRONMENT AND GEOGRAPHY; AND IDEAS, BELIEFS, AND CULTURE — PROVIDE AREAS OF HISTORICAL INQUIRY FOR INVESTIGATION THROUGHOUT THE COURSE. THESE REQUIRE STUDENTS TO REASON HISTORICALLY ABOUT CONTINUITY AND CHANGE OVER TIME AND MAKE COMPARISONS AMONG VARIOUS HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS IN DIFFERENT TIMES AND PLACES.

TO GET THIS PERMIT YOU MUST BE 14 YEARS OLD AND PASS THE VISION SCREENING AND KNOWLEDGE TEST AND PAY THE REQUIRED FEE ESTABLISHED BY THE SOUTH PAGE BOARD OF EDUCATION. OLDER STUDENTS WILL BE ADMITTED AHEAD OF YOUNGER STUDENTS WHEN A QUOTA HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED BY THE ADMINISTRATION. COURSE REQUIREMENTS: SIX HOURS OF BEHIND THE WHEEL DRIVING, NINE HOURS OF IN-CAR OBSERVATION AND THIRTY HOURS OF CLASSROOM WORK. THE COURSE IS DESIGNED TO DEVELOP A STUDENT'S ABILITIES IN DRIVING, BUT DOES NOT GUARANTEE THAT THE STUDENT WILL BE A SAFE AND EFFICIENT DRIVER. THE CLASS WILL PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES TO INCREASE THEIR SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND CONCEPTS, CHALLENGE THEM TO THINK AND WORK INDEPENDENTLY AND COOPERATIVELY. BEING A SAFE DRIVER REQUIRES MORE THAN KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS, IT REQUIRES AN AWARENESS AND CONSIDERATION OF THOSE THING THAT CAN HAVE A NEGATIVE EFFECT UPON YOUR ABILITIES TO DRIVE.
